

Village to discuss waste commission's bylaws

Village of Cremona council is expected to discuss whether or not to support the Mountain View Regional Waste Management Commission in accepting its new bylaws for

information during this month's meeting.

The commission has asked that all member councils support three new bylaws, including one that deals with board appointments and the chair, one stating how rates and fees would be assessed, as

well as the commission's corporate bylaw.

Council did pass a motion to rescind its letter of withdrawal following an in-camera session during the Aug. 25 meeting.

Luana Smith, chief administrative officer for the village, said the

matter was discussed in camera because it was a legal issue.

"They felt that the commission has made a lot of steps in the right direction with moving forward on creating three new bylaws as well as working on a business plan," said Smith, adding

the bylaws will be presented to council during the Oct. 20 meeting.

The village served one year's notice to withdraw from the commission in December of 2014 after the commission increased its 2015 requisitions significantly to its member municipi-

palities to make up for financial losses.

The municipalities of Carstairs, Didsbury and Sundre also served one year's notice of withdrawal at that time; however, all four municipalities have now rescinded their letters of withdrawal.
