

# Chlorine analyzer replaced

Cremona residents' water will no longer smell like a swimming pool, thanks to council's recent approval to spend roughly \$6,000 on a new chlorine analyzer/monitor for the village's water distribution pump-house.

The current monitor is no longer functioning and has been an ongoing problem for the village.

In recent weeks, some residents experienced too much chlorine in their water, and as Coun. Robert Reid said during the Sept. 15 council meeting, it smelled like a swimming pool.

"Our contractor Aquatech has recommended the village purchase a new analyzer which is essential for day-to-day

operations of our quality drinking water code of practice," Luana Smith, chief administrative officer for the village, reported to council.

The chlorine analyzer/monitor measures when chlorine needs to be injected into the system.

"If this piece of equipment is working properly, our public works foreman would receive an alarm that the chlorine levels are too high or too low," she said.

"This is not happening and we have had a few issues with getting the chlorine levels accurate."
